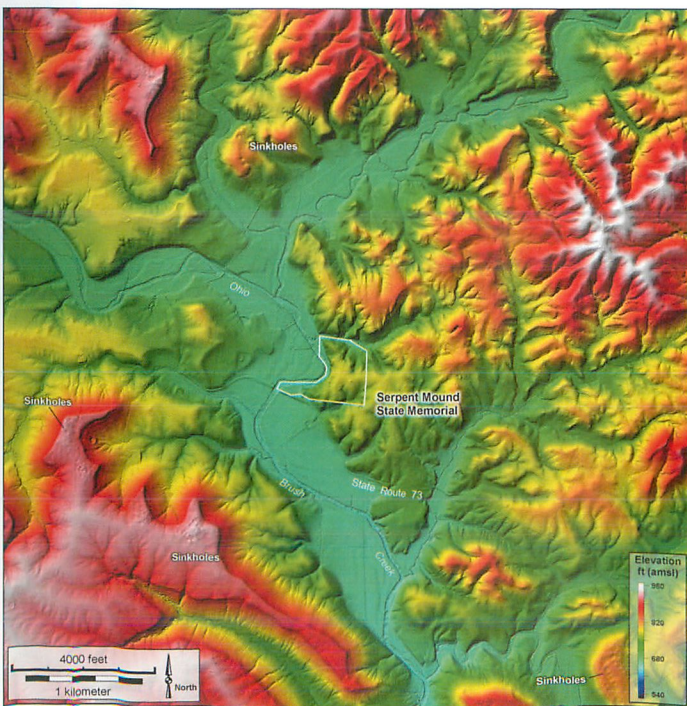


The Serpent Mound Crater has unusual geology, which dates back about 600 million years to the pre-Cambrian period. Rocks exposed in the crater date from 438 million to 345 million years old. At that time there was a "T" shaped fault in the sea floor just east of Serpent Mound, running north-south along the sea floor from Sinking Spring to Locust Grove, and east-west parallel to Parker Ridge Road. Over 250 million years ago an asteroid or meteor collided with the seabed, creating a crater 5 miles wide. This is the only place on earth where an object from space has collided with a rift or fault in the earth's surface. Serpent Mound crater also contains trace elements from the asteroid such as Cobalt, Chromium, Nickel, Iron, Zinc, and Iridium, a rare element usually associated with space rocks and impact craters. ## House of Phacops Smithsonian Gallery Rock shop



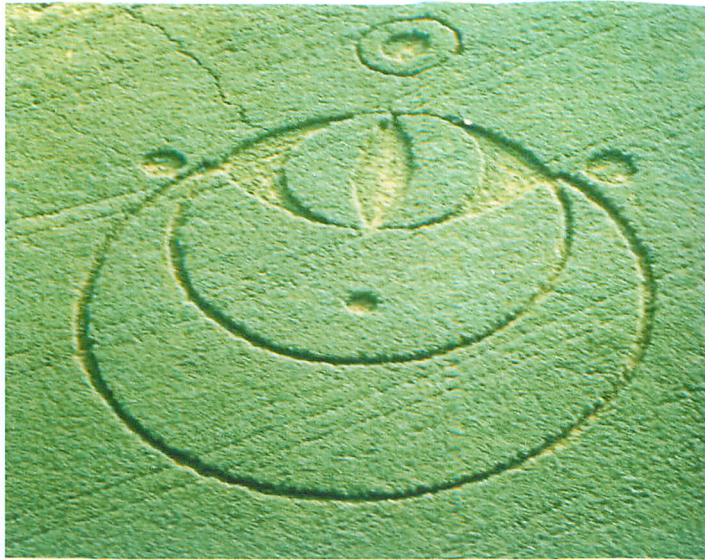
The Trilobite Gallery, "Life in the Ancient Seas" was created to display the Thomas T. Johnson Collection at the Smithsonian US National Museum of Natural History. Some of the specimens have been viewed by over 200 million Smithsonian visitors. 20 years Later The Gallery was moved to the House of Phacops Rock Shop. Curator Tom Johnson, began researching the Isotelus Trilobite, (Official State Fossil of Ohio) since he was a young man. The largest known example of the State fossil is on exhibit at his shop. Built on the foundation of a tannery that operated in Locust Grove around 1850, the building is clad with Ordovician flat rock quarried in Adams County. The Ordovician seabed, dating back 438 million years, attracted Johnson to Adams County because the ancient seabed contains the finest known examples of the Isotelus. Thomas is recognized for his achievements in 1984 by the Smithsonian and National Geographic, he has written 3 books and lectured on the subject of trilobites.

The **Great Serpent Mound** is a 1,348-foot-  
long (411 m), three-foot-high prehistoric  
effigy mound. It sits on a plateau, a half mile  
in, on the western edge of a meteorite Crater  
and runs along Ohio Brush Creek in Adams  
County, Ohio. Radiocarbon analysis estimate  
the construction is approximately 321 BCE.

The Serpent winds back and forth with its  
seven coils, ending in a triple coiled tail — the  
open mouth which is on a miles deep Fault  
line has a 120-foot oval feature that depicts an  
Egg, Sun or Turtle.

The Serpent was connected to the natural  
cycles of birth and death according to many  
ancient cultures.
